

# Odessa Town Council Minutes

## July 26, 2021

### REGULAR ZOOM MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

Mayor Crossley called the regular meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. This meeting was held in person and via the ZOOM app due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, Meeting ID and Password were made available to the public through postings on the office door and the post office community board. The town will be in touch with the property owner at 305 S Alder Street regarding the repairs that should be taking place with their sidewalk issues and repairs.
